Notice no. 2/2021
of the Warsaw University of Technology Rector
of 7 September 2021

In connection with the coming academic year 2021/2022, the following is communicated regarding the predicted mode of teaching in the winter semester:

- 1) at the Warsaw University of Technology in the winter semester of the academic year 2021/2022, education in first-, second- and long-cycle degree programmes and in postgraduate studies and other forms of education will be conducted in the mixed mode, i.e., remote classes will be run for large lecture and seminar groups; in-person classes will be run in all other cases subject to sanitary measures;
- 2) all Warsaw University of Technology employees shall resume the standard mode of work. Introduction of remote work for an employee is possible only in specific individual cases, upon prior application of the unit head to the Vice-Rector for General Affairs, the Chancellor or the Bursar, as applicable.

This notice was issued pursuant to Regulation no. 104/2020 of the WUT Rector of 30 September 2020 on *the functioning of the Warsaw University of Technology during the Covid-19 epidemic since 1 October 2020* (with amendments introduced by regulations no. 58/2021 and 67/2021 of the WUT Rector).

As of 15 August 2021, the Regulation of the Minister of Education and Science of 25 February 2021 on the temporary restriction of functioning of some higher education system subjects in order to prevent, counteract and control Covid-19 (Journal of Acts of 2021, item 363) was lifted, but the state of epidemic is still in effect, therefore it is possible to conduct classes using remote teaching methods and techniques regardless of the fact whether it was foreseen in the study programme pursuant to §13a of the Regulation of the Minister of Science and Higher Education of 27 September 2018 on degree programmes (Journal of Acts of 2021, item 661), as quoted:

”§ 13a. 1. In the period from the announcement of epidemic hazard or the state of epidemic until the end of the semester when the state was lifted, courses in degree programmes may be taught using remote teaching methods and techniques regardless of the fact whether it was foreseen in the study programme.

2. The numbers of ECTS points allocated to courses taught in the period referred to in section 1 using remote teaching methods and techniques are not included in the number of ECTS points referred to in § 13.”
